

Vocabulary

<i>cotton</i>	soft (usually white) fibers attached to the seeds of the cotton plant; threads or cloth woven of cotton
<i>extract</i>	a product made from the juice of a plant
<i>fiber</i>	a natural strand that can be spun into thread or yarn or woven into cloth
<i>flower</i>	the often colorful part of a plant that produces seeds
<i>fruit</i>	the mature, ripened flower part containing a seed; often edible
<i>herb</i>	(1) a non-woody plant that usually dies at the end of the season; (2) a plant valued for its medicinal or flavorful qualities
<i>leaf</i>	the part of a plant that grows from a stem; usually flat and green
<i>root</i>	part of a plant that generally grows downward into the soil, anchoring the plant and gathering nutrients and water
<i>seed</i>	the part of a plant produced by a flower that may grow into a new plant
<i>shrub</i>	a low-growing, woody plant, usually with several stems
<i>stem</i>	the part of the plant that grows up from the roots and usually supports flowers, leaves, and other stems or branches
<i>shoot</i>	new growth, especially new branches
<i>tree</i>	a tall, woody plant, usually with one main stem
<i>woody</i>	describes a plant that has a stiff stem made of wood
