

MY VISIT TO THE HUNTINGTON

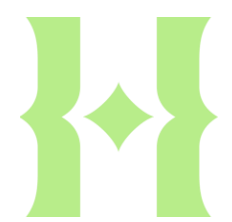




This story will help me understand my day at The Huntington. It will help me know some of the things I can see, do, and experience during my visit.

I will wait while the security guards check my bags. The security team's job is to help keep me and the collections safe.

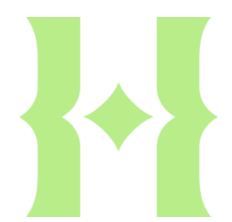




I will wait to check in with visitor services. We need to check in because we do not want The Huntington to be too crowded.

The Huntington is a big place with lots to see and do.

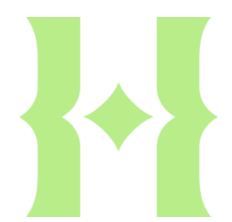
Sometimes there are many people, and sometimes there are few.

Some things, like guest activities, are for touching and exploring. Other things, like art and plants, are for looking at only. I will remember to keep my hands to myself for those special things.



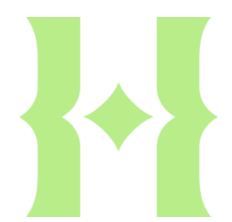


During my visit, I can take a break if I get tired.

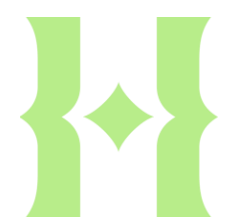
